Research interests:

Primary research interests are in assessment, prevention, and treatment of violence and victimization. Currently, I have been working in the area of juvenile sex offending. I am P.I. on a large contract with the Alabama Department of Youth Services to develop, manage, and assess a program to provide treatment services to all juvenile sex offenders who have been committed to DYS. To date, we have provided treatment services to over 600 juvenile sex offenders. In addition, as a component of the assessment procedure, we have collected comprehensive psychological data on all of the juvenile sex offenders and have comparison data on 200 non-sex offending juvenile delinquents.
